

In the Publication Partner Program, experienced scientists form partnerships with authors who want additional input. The aim is to increase the likelihood of worthy papers being published in the journal, and the focus is on authors from developing and non-English speaking jurisdictions. When editors receive manuscripts that are not publishable but which could be, given the right construction, analysis, and emphasis, they may ask the authors if they would like to partner with an experienced scientist to develop a revision. If the author agrees, then the editor puts them in contact with a publication partner, an experienced volunteer committed to the program's goals. The partner then works with the authors to develop a resubmission. The manuscript's authors may acknowledge their publication partner or they may invite the partner to be a co-author, depending on the partner's contribution.
